To assist our staff and stewards, and to help protect you and your fellow spectators, you are required to follow the below guidelines when visiting our home venues. These measures meet the requirements of current legislation, guidance from the ECB and Safety at Sports Grounds (SGSA) regulations.

These may be different from your last visit and they may also change throughout the season. We kindly ask that supporters are patient with staff and each other as we work to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all.

SPECTATOR CODE OF CONDUCT

- All attendees must carry out their own personal risk assessment, taking into consideration age, health status and clinical vulnerability.
- Respect fellow supporters and show consideration whilst at any of our venues.
- We are a cashless venue, with supporters encouraged to pay via contactless methods where possible.
- Supporters are reminded that Tickets, Memberships and Blast Passes are not to be passed to any other individual. Doing so will result in refusal of entry and cancellation without refund.

We all need to play our part. The above conditions have been implemented by the Club as a condition of reopening and failure to do so impacts on the safety of everyone and will result in the Club taking action at the time, and after the game. This will include:

- Verbal warning(s)
- Ejection from The Central Co-op County Ground
- Ground ban
- Cancellation of Membership without compensation
